## **EXAMINATION SYSTEM**

#### **Under Graduate Courses**

All Under Graduate courses follow semester pattern with respect to Teaching and Evaluation. The Academic year is divided into Two Semesters. The first or Odd Semester is from June – October and the second or Even Semester is from November – March. Each Semester has Two Internal Examinations with one End-Semester Examination in the ratio of 40:60 marks in each subject as part of a reliable and sustainable evaluation process.

## A. RULES OF ATTENDANCE/SEMESTER EXAMINATION ELIGIBILITY

- A student will be permitted to take the end semester assessment (ESA) examination in all subjects only if he/she has put in at least 75 % of attendance (Theory and Practical separately) in each subject.
- On medical grounds a student is permitted a condonation of 10 % attendance on payment of condonation fee, provided the student submits the medical certificate immediately after the period of illness.

- Students having less than 65 % of attendance in a subject will not be allowed to write the examination for the subject.
- Students attending state/national camps/workshops have to produce the attendance certificate duly signed by the principal immediately after the camps.
- A student who is not allowed to write end semester examination due to shortage of attendance has to repeat the same semester the next year.

#### End Semester Assessment (ESA):

### a. Theory Papers

- Written Examination for each subject is conducted for 60 marks with a duration of 3 hours.
- Students have to secure a minimum of 22 marks (36%) out of 60 in End Semester Examination and a total of 36(CIA+ESA) marks out of 100 marks to pass in every subject.

#### b. Practical Papers

- Practical Examination for each subject is conducted for 30 marks with duration of 3 Hours.
- Students have to secure a minimum of 11 marks (36%) out of 30 in End Semester Practical Examination and a total of 18(CIA+ESA) marks out of 50 marks to pass in every subject.

## **CAMPUS CULTURE**

Regularity and punctuality are closely monitored.

Students are expected to be in the classroom by 8.30 a.m.

#### a) General Instructions

The students are also expected to be goal-focused and career - oriented to emerge as team builders in society.    The students coming late will not be allowed inside the college premises.

The disciplinary committee will deal seriously with any misbehavior that disrupts the teaching learning. #### • Attendance Counts ...

- ✓ Students who put in 100% attendance are appreciated with a gift cheque of Rs 1000/- on the Annual Day. It is mandatory for every student to put in 75% attendance in order to appear for the end- semester/OU examinations.
- ✓ Examination forms shall not be issued to students with less than 65% attendance.
- ✓ Leave letters should be duly signed by parents and submitted to the lecturer /class-in-charge. If the student is absent for more than three days, the leave letter should be duly signed by the Principal.
- ✓ All genuine leave applications should be submitted to the Principal/Vice Principal for approval.
- ✓ Only in genuine cases, a maximum of 10% condonation that too on medical grounds, on payment of prescribed condonation fee is permitted.

## d) Misconduct

- Damaging the library books/identity cards etc.

**Note:** College property is common property. If any fixture or equipment is damaged, the entire cost will be deducted from caution deposit of the students of the respective class/section.

- Inviting/meeting strangers in the college without prior written permission from the Principal.
- Failure to return borrowed material or settle debts with the college.
- Any form of misbehavior viz., Eve teasing/Ragging etc. will be firmly dealt with as per institution /Govt. rules.
  [Ragging is prohibited within or outside of any Educational Institution in AP State (Act 26 of 1997)].

## **TEACHING - LEARNING PRACTICES**

- Entry Level Test: At the entry level the departments conduct proficiency tests to assess the standards of the students and plan bridge courses to suitably fill the gaps.
- Bridge Courses: Bridge courses are planned to fill the gaps in their existing knowledge and pave way for conceptual learning. The course is well structured and planned depending on the subjects. Those who hail from vernacular medium and those who come from rural background are given training. Thorough and diligent efforts are made to homogenize the group.
- **Certificate Courses:** Certificate courses conducted in collaboration with industry experts supplement the curriculum and enhance the employability of students.
- Guest Lecturers / Extension Lectures/Seminars/
  Workshops: To supplement and extend learning beyond class
  room teaching, experts and eminent personalities from the
  industry and academics are regularly invited to interact with the
  students and share their expertise and experience in specific areas.

- Multi dimensional learning experiences: Presentations, group discussion, role plays, book review, part of our co-curricular activities, as these enhance their inter-personal communication skills and help to develop their overall personality.
- Value addition and Personality Development Programmes: Our College stands for value-based education and strives for the overall development of the students. In pursuit of the motto "Knowledge, Love and Service" and in line with the college vision, the Counseling cell, faculty members and resource persons conduct value addition and Personality Development Programmes.
- Tutorial Classes: Classes are held after the college working hours to help out those students who require further assistance and guidance in their learning process.
- **Remedial classes:** Extra classes are conducted for academically weak students after college hours.
- Curriculum based other programs:
  - ✓ Project Presentation & Counseling: Counseling sessions are held to help students prepare for live market and Industry relevant projects.
  - ✓ English Proficiency Counseling: English proficiency counseling sessions help the students identify their problem areas with respect to communication in English, and also aid in refining their speaking and writing skills.

## STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

The College gives individual attention to students in order to equip them with the required skills and to bridge the gap between the traditional curriculum and the changing employment needs.

- Orientation /Induction Programme: An orientation programme for freshers is organised to orient them into the campus and academic culture of the college giving them information about the clubs, community service, course outline, examination system etc. A conducive environment for effective learning is set with motivational talks on goal setting, time management etc.
- Experiential Learning: To promote experiential learning the
  college organises various outbound programmes, industrial
  visits/field visits etc as these increase Institution-Industry
  interaction and create among the students an awareness and
  understanding of the practical aspects of the industry.
- Soft Skills: Soft Skills development being a major area in promoting global competencies, the college conducts Workshops/seminars/guest lectures on interpersonal skills, goal setting, team work, presentation skills, corporate skills, decision making, etc. Eminent resource persons are invited for motivational talks on personality development, communication skills and soft skills.
- Women Empowerment Cell: The Women Empowerment Cell in conjunction with eminent women welfare organizations like Obstetric and Gynecological Society of Hyderabad empowers the girl students through conducting various awareness programmes on health, legal, social and career prospects. The Cell also addresses day to day issues/challenges faced by the

- girls both on and off the campus. Apart from formal counseling the girl students are given freedom to approach experienced and friendly lady faculty anytime to seek their help.
- Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC): The College has an Entrepreneur Development Cell (EDC) to develop entrepreneur skills among students. The Cell conducts entrepreneurship development programs in collaboration with MSME (Micro Small and Medium Enterprise) and NEN (National entrepreneurship network) to make students aware of the different financial schemes offered by the Government of India. It also equips them with entrepreneurship skills to start and run their own business initiatives.
- In-house Publications: The Editorial Board of the college, along with student representatives with a flair for writing, publish the college News letter "Joseph's Chronicle". Students of Mass Communication bring out "JosepHeights" news letter.
- Counseling & Value Education Cell: Counseling and Value Education Cell offers guidance and help to students in personal, social and vocational spheres. Regular value education sessions are conducted in the college. Life skills are taught as a means to empower young people to face challenging situations. This enables learners to acquire knowledge and to develop right attitudes and life skills which lead to a healthy behavior.
- Student Facilitator / Class In-Charge: A lecturer is designated
  to function as a focal point for solving students' problems related
  to academics and discipline. Students can approach the facilitator
  on a one-to- one basis to enhance their academic performance
  and offer consultation on any student-related activites/issues.

- Audio Visual Lab & PA system: Audio Visual room with a plasma TV and other Home Theater equipment offers multimedia learning experience for the students making for infotainment. A good Public Address system is available on the campus for seminars and presentations.
- Career Guidance: Talks and lectures by Guest Faculty drawn from various disciplines and industry experts give in-depth information about career choices available for the students so that they make informed choices.
- Grievance Cell: The Cell caters to the complaints and suggestions of the students, be it academic or non-academic. The students are encouraged to approach any one of the grievance committee members or drop in their suggestions / complaints in the suggestion boxes kept near the office, library and computer lab. Twice a week, the boxes are opened and the grievance committee proactively deals with them.
- Moodle: To encourage the use of virtual learning resources the college has taken initiation to introduce "MOODLE" (Modular Object Oriented Dynamic Learning Environment). Moodle open source software is a learning management system with a set of teaching and learning tools designed to enhance a student's learning experience by including computers and the internet in the learning process. Faculty can upload instruction material, documents, assignment instructions, links to web sites thus learning can be extended beyond the limitations of a traditional classroom setting through chat sessions, discussions, collaboration spaces, quizzes, surveys and more.
- **Akshara software:** A client-server application "Insight" is deployed for maintaining the office administration, attendance and examination process to facilitate students and staff.

- Student Feedback System: Students can administer Academic Feedback on Teaching Faculty for effective Teaching Learning Practice and Teaching-Learning evaluation.
- Student Quality Assurance Cell (SQAC): The Student Quality Cell (SQAC) mainly acts as an interface between the student community and the management. The Management, staff and the elected representatives from each class meet consistently once a month to deliberate on issues regarding students' welfare & enhance the quality of the institution. This is an extremely important body as it redresses grievances and steps up the quality parameters of the college. The proactive involvement of the students in effective governance also nurtures their leadership skills.

- ✓ Mathematics lab: The Mathematics Lab aims to provide students with improved methods of conceptualization. Various teaching modules and simulations are set up in the lab to make the learning of mathematics effective and joyful.
- ✓ SPSS Lab: The College has well established SPSS lab with 20 systems. Statistical Package for Social Sciences is a comprehensive statistical and data management package. Its statistical capabilities alone range from simple percentages to complex analysis of variance, multiple regression & general linear models which help to generate tabulated reports, charts, plots of distributions and trends.
- ✓ English Lab (Language Lab): Facilitates CBT (Computer Based Testing). Language lab has learning CDs that are entirely learner-oriented and offer model tests for the learner to assess his/her listening skills. The Lab is also equipped with sophisticated New Multimedia and advanced skills software of K-Van Solution. It includes 30 Computer Systems with head phones and an LCD Projector.
- ✓ Mass Com Lab: An Audio Video Production Studio equipped
  with modern digital technologies provides the students
  knowledge on modern media production techniques.

- Well- equipped class rooms: Spacious, well furnished and ventilated classrooms equipped with ICT- backed teaching aids like LCD and OHP, in addition to Chalk and Board offer conducive learning environment.

The college has excellent network with reputed companies like Amazon, Igate, Deloitte, E-Boss, GE(Cap), HSBC, Cognizant, NTT Data GDS, Cognizant (BPO), Apollo Health Street, WIPRO (WiSTA), Virtusa, Franklin Templeton , Genpact, Fact set, UBS, etc,.

**NOTE:** Final year Students of UG/PG can register with placement cell. Only registered students will be considered for placement and CRT programme. Selection of students will be entirely at the discretion of the concerned company/ organization. Placement cell does not guarantee any placement of students.

## d) Games & Sports:

The Sports facilities in the campus include a well qualified Physical Director, Basket Ball and Volley Ball Courts and Indoor games like Carroms, Table Tennis and Chess. As the college has limited ground for outdoor sports, the institution hires Osmania University and Nizam College grounds for professional coaching and for holding competitions. A spacious cellar is available for indoor games like Chess, Carroms and Table Tennis.

Pre- Competition coaching is given in two sessions Morning & Evening.

## e) Extension Services and Extra Curricular Activities:

Social Consciousness and Commitment are an integral part of the College vision. The extension programmes in the institution are organized through four basic units: **NSS** (National Service Scheme), YRC (Youth Red Cross), (JGG) Joseph's Green Group and Women Empowerment Cell. The faculty and students are sensitized on their social responsibilities, environmental awareness and citizenship roles through participation in Community development programmes, health and hygiene awareness programmes, AIDS awareness programmes, gender sensitizing programmes, medical and blood donation camps, environmental awareness programmes, Visits to Homes for Street children, Rescue Centers, Orphanages, HIV/AIDS centers, Home for the aged and destitute, mentally and physically challenged Children etc. Tree plantations, Medical Camps and surveys are also conducted in the adopted villages. College-community neighborhood networks include our students educating the less privileged neighborhood children. Students are involved in various community development programmes, social and environment awareness campaigns so that they emerge as ethical and socially responsible citizens of India.

## f) Extra Curricular Activities:

To promote integrated development and holistic learning, students are encouraged to take an active part in extracurricular activities, both conducted by the college and represented by the college. The college provides a platform for students to showcase their innate talents by hosting many celebrations and fest which include National Festivals, College Day, Fresher's Day, Farwell Day, Teacher's Day, Christmas and Cultural Fest etc

The Students are encouraged to play an active role by participating in various cultural activities within and outside the college.

Through organizing such national events the students get opportunities to learn event organizing skills as well as an opportunity to interact and learn from eminent media personalities.
